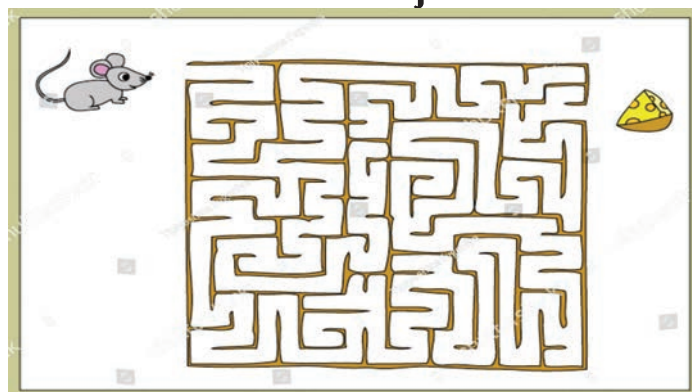

- प्र. विद्यार्थी मात्र आपका एक सख्त शासक वाला चेहरा जानते हैं आपकी दूसरी छवि क्या है ?
- उ. मुझे खेल अति प्रिय है इसलिए मैदान में खिलाड़ी हूँ। मैं जब प्रधानाचार्य की कुर्सी पर हूँ तब मुझ पर एक राष्ट्र के भविष्य की जिम्मेदारी है और हर जिम्मेदारी के साथ जो ताकत मिलती है उसका न्यायोचित तरीके से उपयोग करता हूँ। जो इस ताकत का उपयोग नहीं करते वे अपनी जिम्मेदारी के प्रति निष्ठावान नहीं हैं। ताकत का सदुपयोग संस्था की भलाई के लिए आवश्यक है और इन दोनों को साथ चलाना भी जरूरी है। हर स्थान, समय के अनुसार छवि और कर्तव्य बदलते हैं।

- उ. यह एक बड़ा परिवार है। पिछले विद्यालय या तो पूर्णतः डे बोर्डिंग थे या पूर्णतः बोर्डिंग।
