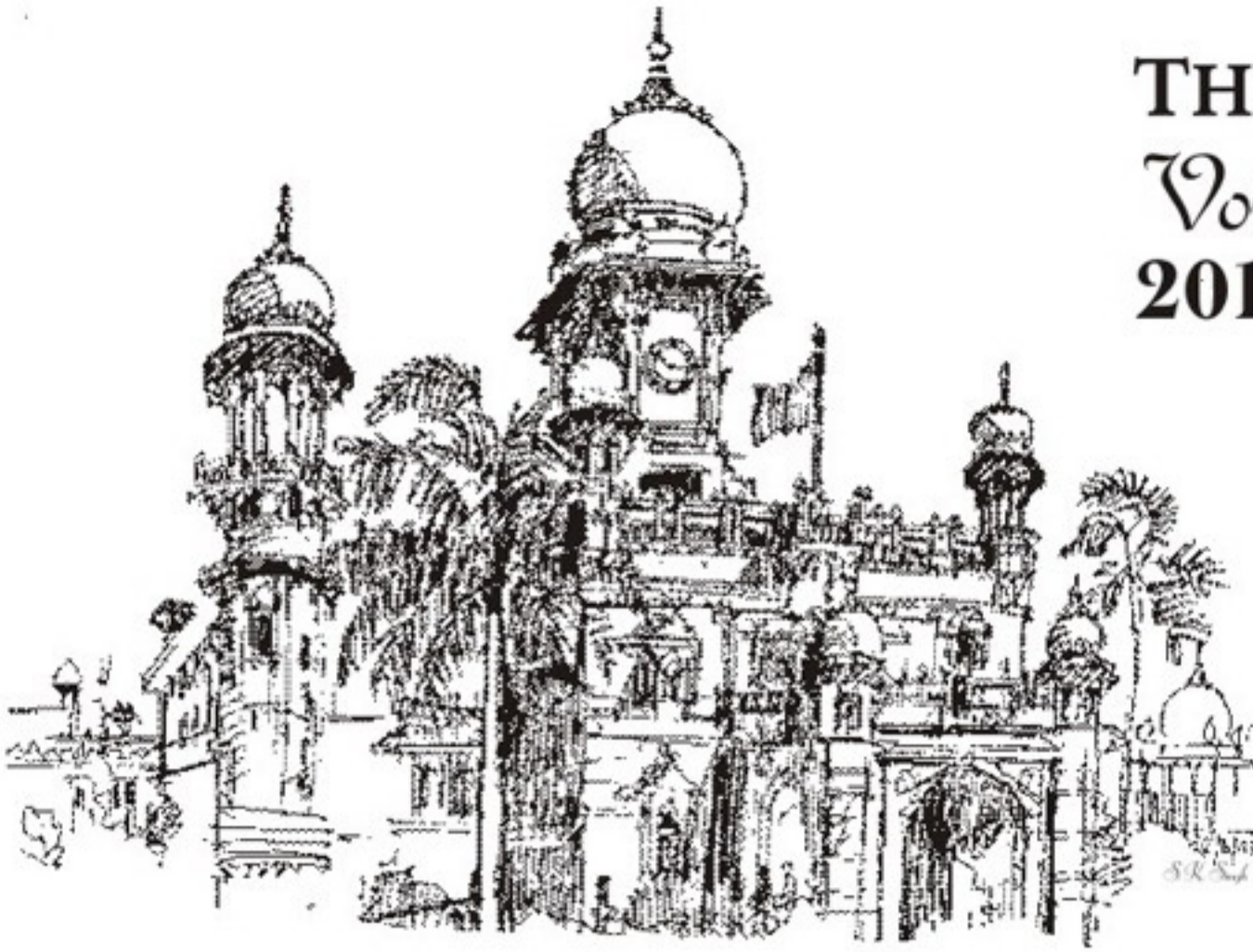

~IPSC CULTURAL FEST~
PERFORMING ARTS

Three days of sheer delirium. Three days of the most enthralling performances. Three Days of epitome of school spirit. These three days remind me of nothing but the IPSC Cultural Fest (Performing Arts) 2010, hosted by the Daly College on the 16th, 17th and 18th October 2010.

After last year's disappointment over the cancellation of the IPSC Cultural Fest, this year's Fest was eagerly awaited by many. A total of 12 schools participated in the Fest, namely, Birla Balika Vidyapeeth (Pilani), Kittur Rani Chinnamma (Kittur), L.K. Singhanian (Gotan), Mayo College (Ajmer), Mayo College Girls' School (Ajmer), Maharani Gayatri Devi Girl's School (Jaipur), Rashtriya Indian Military College (Dehradun), Scindia Kanya Vidyalaya (Gwalior), Vallabh Ashram School (Valsad), Vidya Devi Jindal School (Hissar), Yadavindra Public School (Patiala) and the Daly College (Indore).

On the first day, we witnessed some sterling performances in Bhajan, Classical Solo Dance, Classical Vocal Solo, English Skit and Western Dance. Shivani Karmarkar and Shourya Jain of the Daly College gave a magnificent start to the festival by bagging the I position in Classical Solo Dance and Bhajan respectively. It must also be noted that Shourya Jain received a standing ovation by both, the judges and spectators for her superb singing. Even though Tanya Sojatia of the Daly College won the hearts of the audience with her serenading voice, Parveen Khan of MGD vanquished her and emerged as the winner of the event. In the next event, the English Skit, MCGS captivated the audience with an engaging performance and came first. Mayo College and the Daly College gave highly commendable performances and stood second and third respectively.

The festival was inaugurated by Shreemati Archana Chitnis, Minister for School Education, MP. Govt.

Then, the day witnessed the most riveting event- the Western Dance. All the troupes danced with rapture but the Daly College bagged the first place with a ravishing performance, followed by Vallabh Ashram School.

On the second day, the Dalians once again proved their mettle. The day started with Paritosh Gupta's meritorious performance in Classical Instrumental Solo, in which he stood first. Playing the role of Gandhari, Shalini Jain of LKS, Gotan won the first position with her commendable performance. Although Aman Godha of the Daly College gave fierce competition to Shalini, he had to be content with the second place. Simultaneously, in the Western Orchestra, the Daly College once again outshined all other schools and stood first. Also, in the Hindi Skit, DC rose above all other schools and was rightly awarded the first position; LKS, Gotan grabbed the second position and VDJS, the third. The Daly College finished first in the Western Group Song. In the final event of the day, the Folk Dance, all schools gave striking performances, however, participant from MGD

Girl's School held the audience spellbound thus securing the first position.

After two days of spectacular performances, the third day started with great aplomb. In the first event of the day, Western Vocal Solo, Tanya Sojatiya's melodious singing got the Daly College the first place. Yet again, DC stood first in the Classical Instrumental Group and the Hindi Group Song with their scintillating shows.

Then arrived the most awaited event of the Fest, Choreography. The theme "Returning from the Edge" was aptly highlighted in each school's performance. The Daly College, focusing on the omnipresent problem of Drug Addiction, put up a brilliant show and came first. Not lagging behind were VDJS and MGD Girls' School, who came second and third respectively.

To grace the Fest with his presence, Mr. Vipul Shah, a prominent cinema Director and Producer, acquiesced to be the Chief Guest for the Closing Ceremony. He was accompanied by Ms. Sharbani Mukherjee & Mr. Sangeeth Sivan. A total number of 252 individual prizes and 4 category prizes of Indian Music, Western Music, Dance and Drama were awarded at the Closing Ceremony.

Though the host school, The Daly College emerged as the overall winner with 174.5 points. Adhering to Public Schools' traditions, the winners trophy was awarded to Mayo College Girls' School which stood second with 142 points. With a total of 134.5 points, Maharani Gayatri Devi Girls' School was awarded the Runners-up trophy.

En masse, after all the hard work put in by the management, teachers and most importantly, the students, the Fest was declared a success. Tremendous amount of Bohemia prevailed during the Fest amongst the budding talent of public schools.

We bring you an excerpt from the conversation which the Director Cultural Affairs, Mr. A. Ansari had with Pragya Mandovra, member of the Editorial Board.

a) Can you trace the journey of IPSC?

IPSC Cultural Festival got started in 2001 at Mayo College Girls' School, Ajmer followed by Maharani Gayatri Devi College, Jaipur hosting in 2002. First two years, The Daly College did not participate for reasons unknown to me.

In 2003, Kr. Sumer Singh appeared on the horizon of The Daly College and it was then only that he allocated a portfolio of cultural activities to me (before I was more known as the English H.O.D. and the cricket incharge). Kr. Sumer Singh probably rather quickly was able to identify the talents the Dalians had in cultural activities so he started giving a unique kind of support to these activities and the result was that the school kept on growing and growing in these activities and you all know exactly where we are today.



b.) Tell us something about the IPSC Culture.

Inter Public School Conference stands for certain policies, certain standards of excellence, besides the background that the children come from makes them to be shown as a cut above the rest. The atmosphere in these kinds of schools is congenial and looking for all round development of the students. That's why you see that the students in such huge number get together to get a whip of national unity and bonhomie.

c) What difference did you find in the IPSC Cultural Fest 2005 and 2010?

During IPSC in 2005, all the four parts of the festival were jointly held at The Daly College. After 2006 festival there has been a bifurcation because of which literary, fine arts, IT and the performing arts festival have been segregated and in most cases organized by different schools

In 2005, we did not have the auditorium and many other facilities yet we managed a grand show. As far as this year's fest is concerned where we have organized the Performing Arts Fest, definitely there has been more sheen on the stage. Thanks to the great facilities. Performing arts as it is happens to be the most attractive, exciting and the most happening Fest I am glad that the festival has been a huge success organization wise and what to talk about the DC performance!!!

d) What do you feel about the level of Competition?

In many areas the competition has been of the highest standards which have been able to find the appreciation and admiration of even the judges. It's good to see that other schools are right at the back of the three leading schools in these skills, The Daly College, Mayo College Girls' School & Maharani Gayatri Devi School. You need sustenance and regular practice in performing arts. Daly's advantage was that it was able to find suitable replacements for some of its great artists of the past.

I'd like to thank the Principal and the staff for their tremendous amount of support and very especially the prefects on duty and the student managers. Long Live The DC!!

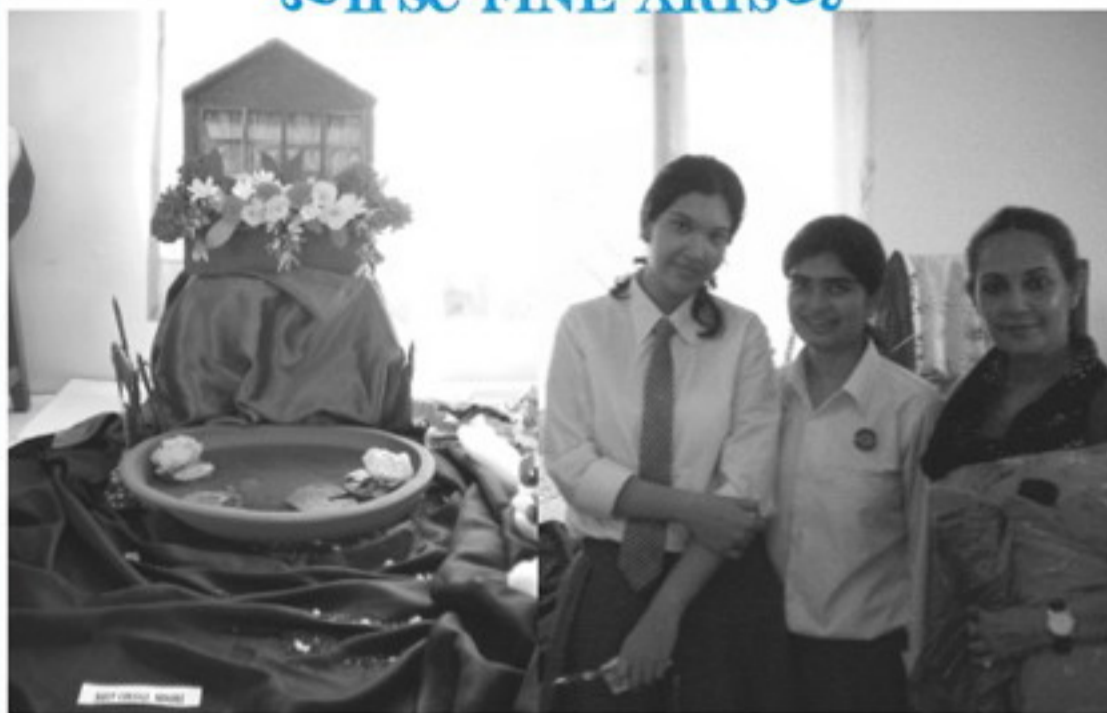

I have found a baptism record, which I attach from the papers regarding Sir Henry's cadetship in the Army which seems to answer the problem totally.

I attach it. Sir Henry was born in October 1821 and baptised on

4 November 1821. It would not seem possible for his parents to have taken him from Kirkee to the Isle of Wight in a few weeks,

and it would not have been a natural thing to do, for a couple to travel long distances with an unbaptised baby.
