Chief Guest for the evening, Prince Yashwant Rao Holkar, members of the Board of Governors, guests, parents, grandparents, Old Dalians, friends of the school, staff, and above all, dear children, a very warm good evening to all of you, and an even warmer welcome to all of you to the 154th Annual Prize Giving celebrations on this, the seventh day of December 2024. Ladies and gentlemen, in particular, I feel honored to welcome this evening Prince Yashwant Rao Holkar as our Chief Guest.

As the 16th direct descendant of Punyashlok Lokmata Devi Ahilya Bai Holkar and grandson of His Highness Maharaja Yashwant Rao Holkar II, the last ruler of Indore state, he continues to uphold and enhance the grandeur of his heritage. His academic accomplishments include an undergraduate degree in Finance from Franklin and Marshall College in Pennsylvania, and an MBA from the globally renowned INSEAD in France. We also extend a very warm welcome to this year's Padma Shri R N Zutshi Medal winner, Mr. Sultan Singh, Dr. Parvez Pohowalla, who also jointly received the award, is not present with us here today. They are both Old Dalians who have excelled themselves in their chosen fields. I also extend a very warm welcome to Dr. Manish Patel, the recipient of a new award introduced this year by the President BOG called the President's Commendation Award.

Ladies and gentlemen, we share a commitment and a responsibility to empower the children of today with essential tools to thrive in a world that is transforming at an unprecedented speed. It was only maybe a couple of years back or maybe four or five years back when we were talking about the VUCA world, the volatile, uncertain, complex and ambiguous VUCA world. Now you see so many others, and I've spoken about this with my children but at the cost of repetition, now you hear of the BANI world, brittle, anxious, non-linear and incomprehensible.

You also hear of the TUNA world, turbulent, uncertain, novel and ambiguous. We are not away from what they call the RUPT world, rapid, unpredictable, paradoxical and tangled. I heard yet another term which says the CAGE world, complex, ambiguous, global and exponential.

This evening I want to talk about something fundamental and that is something that I've been talking about in all my speeches throughout the year and that is the three desires of the human soul. I've spoken about this in almost every address throughout the year and a befitting conclusion to my sharing of thoughts at the APG. So what are the three eternal desires of the human soul irrespective of the VUCA and the BANI and the RUPT, whatever world we live in, three eternal desires of the human soul?

The first is Expression. Every human being wants to be heard, wants to be seen, wants to show the world who we are. We feel suffocated if we are not able to express ourselves and it's not expression only in terms of words.

Those who can't express themselves in words express themselves in paintings. Our children express themselves in a dance. There are so many different ways of expressing but it is a human desire, desire of the human soul to be able to, to be wanting to express oneself. It's about sharing your inner gifts in whichever way. The challenge is to fully embrace the soul's character and purpose by accessing our inborn gifts and talents and thereby give meaning to our life. Our children who are participating whether it was in the Lion King or whether it will be in the evening production are also expressing themselves in some way.

So that's the first, the first desire of the human soul, Expression. The second desire of the human soul is Connection. I remember having spoken about Connection in my entire speech in 2022. Expression leads to Connection. We want to be connected with our friends, with our family, with our neighbors, with our colleagues, with our bosses, with our subordinates, with everyone. But to me connection with all of these people is defined by the connection that we have with our own selves. That defines our connection with everybody else. And what defines our connection with our own selves? Our connection with money defines our connection with ourselves. Our connection with time defines our connection with ourselves. Our connection with power, our connection with authority, our connection with our own existence defines our connection with our own self which then decides and defines the connection with the rest of the world and of course, to me personally, the biggest and the strongest connection is a connection with the divine, with the Almighty. Thereafter,

after expression and connection, the third human desire is of Contribution. We all innately want to contribute.

That's our inner, inner spontaneous desire. You know, I have a friend who is a leading radiologist in Punjab. He had some liver problem, so he went to the hospital in Ludhiana for a check-up and he was coming out of the doctor's chamber and walking towards the reception. His wife moved faster to clear the bills and he had his first epileptic attack. He was not a patient of epilepsy, but as he was walking out, and he had his first epileptic attack. I don't know how many of you know it, but in an epilepsy, you're not supposed to hold the patient because the inner muscles and bones and everything, they just vibrate. So you just have to, if at all you want to help, you just hold the person lightly and allow the body to do its vibrations or whatever.

Now, when the doctor had this epileptic attack, he was going through the reception area. I mean, dozens of people, they just went and in an effort to help him, they all just held him, you know, he shouldn't fall and they held him so tight and they held him against the force of the inner body that both his shoulder bones broke. I'm not talking about what happened.

The point that I'm trying to make is that it's a spontaneous desire to help even to an unknown person. That is our inner desire of the human soul, the desire to contribute. From Maslow's hierarchy, we know all of that, to Richard Barrett's model, even spiral dynamics, all theories of human motivation highlight this truth.

At the end of the day, what is life if not an opportunity to express, to connect, and to contribute? These are not just desires to me; they are the foundation of a very meaningful life-Expression, Connection, and Contribution. Ladies and gentlemen, yes, contribution.

Prince Holkar's contributions are both profound and far-reaching. As a custodian of a great legacy, he has passionately restored several places of worship across India. He excelled in the world of investment banking in New York and Singapore before returning to India to contribute meaningfully to his homeland. We all connect with the vision of Sir Henry Daly, and I pay a tribute to the soul of this great man. Expression, Connection, and Contribution. Yes, ladies and gentlemen, expression.



I express my deepest gratitude to a very supportive and encouraging Board of Governors. His Highness Maharaj Vikram Singh Puar of Dewas Senior, President, Board of Governors, is a visionary, forward-thinking leader, and a proud alumnus of Daly College. He inspires us with his boundless energy and heartfelt commitment to elevating Daly College to unmatched heights of excellence.

The speed with which he wants to work, I marvel at my own speed and I'm very proud of my speed, but the speed at which he wants to work keeps me on my toes, and Maharaj, thank you for keeping me on my toes. His Highness Maharaj Narendra Singh Jhabua is not here today. We value his presence on the Board.

His Highness Maharaj of Narsingarh brings a sense of tradition and modernity that strengthen Daly College's commitment to excellence and



progress. Maharaj Priyavrat Singh contributes profound insights and timeless wisdom towards innovation and success. Mr. Dheeraj Lulla is the soul of Daly College and the soul of its progress. He offers valuable perspectives, tirelessly dedicating himself to its growth and embodying the institution's spirit every single day with energy and enthusiasm. Mr. Monu Bhatia stands as a pillar of strength with unwavering support that

anchors Daly College through every endeavor, crisis, thick and thin, always, everywhere. Mr. Sandeep Parikh actively participates in school discussions and is present for all school events. Mr. Sanjay Pahwa is a compassionate advocate for parents, seamlessly addressing their concerns with a focus on building trust and collaboration. Mr. Sumit Chandhok's approach consistently drives Daly College to growth and success. Thank you, my dear Board members; my respected Board members! Your unwavering support and dedication are the driving force behind everything we accomplish. Expression, Connection and Contribution! Yes, ladies and gentlemen, expression once again!

The Principal's APG speech is an expression of the achievements and successes of the children under our care. I have so many to show off, so many achievements to boast of, but in the interest of time, I've picked up only the key ones and let me tell you that itself is quite a bit.

We continue our focus on academics as is evident from the improved Board results. Yuvraj Agarwal topped class 12 with 96.6%, better than last year. 22 students scored above 90%. Three scored a perfect 100 and 100 in Psychology and one a perfect 100 in Music.

Six students out of 14 scored 99 out of 100 in Painting. Overall, there is a substantial improvement in the percentage of students getting distinctions and first divisions. In grade 10, Daksh Bhatnagar topped the class with 97.2%. 24 students scored above 90% and of these, five achieved more than 95%. Six scored a perfect 100 on 100, two in Mathematics and four in French. The school average increased by a whopping 6%. In CI class 12, 38% students have scored grades A* and A. Saadgi Garg topped with three A* and two As and Vivaan Gautam with three A* and one A. In CI grade 10, 40% were awarded with a distinction and 60% Merit Certificates in Cambridge IC group award.

Aditya Dev topped the class with 8 A* and one A and Niaa Baheti with 7 A* and 2 As. I received an email this morning, on the 7th of December, that Saara Lunawat has won the prestigious Cambridge Outstanding Learners Award, 24.

Overall, the number of students who have received College Color for academics has increased to 38 this year as compared to 21 last year. There is also a substantial increase in the number of students who have received college academic badges and merit certificates. As part of our ongoing commitment to providing world class exposure to our students, DC hosted several top universities like John Hopkins University, Boston

University, Imperial College, London, and University College, London.

In addition, an international university fair was organized featuring participation from over 85 universities from across the world. 20 students attended summer schools in the best of universities, including Brown, Howard, Oxford and NUS. 15 completed AI internships with Amazon Web Services.

Students of grade 7 to 9 are enrolled in Project Based Learning KRUU, where they interact with professors from across the world. The class of 24 students has secured coveted spots in prestigious institutions such as IIM, Indore, Ashoka University, Hansraj College, SRCC, NMIMS, Jai Hind College, St. Xavier's College, and Mithibai College in India and, if you please, the Penn State, USA, along with Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, Indiana University, Bloomington, Boston University, UT Dallas,

University of Wisconsin, University of Washington, Stony Brook, Drexel, all in USA, Imperial College, London, University of Toronto, New South Wales, University of Western Australia, and the LaSalle College of Arts in Singapore.

Expression, Connection, and Contribution. Yes, ladies and gentlemen, once again, contribution. Gary David Gilberg once said, "It takes a lot of people to make a winning team". Everybody's contribution is

important.23-24 has been yet another year of stellar achievements at the regional, national, and international level in sports. Some of the highlights, and this is my favorite section of my report, the academics and the sports. Hear this out.

Shivam Kapasia of grade 6 set a new record at the All India IPSC shooting. Arnav Sharda has been appointed captain of the Madhya Pradesh under-16 cricket team. Arvi Jain, all of 13 years old, has been appointed captain of the Madhya Pradesh under-13 girls' table tennis team.

Team DC represented Indore at the Nehru Cup tournament. It's a very prestigious hockey tournament and DC represented at the Nehru Cup tournament and stood second runners -up in both the boys' and the girls' categories. We won the overall championship in the CBSE Cluster Athletics meet in the boys' division. Saharsh Shahra emerged as a champion in the boys' under-15 category at the GCH All India Squash Championship. Stellar performances were given in tennis by Vihaan Nawab, Vaidehi Shukla, Aanya Rathi, and Reet Arora.

We lifted the Kishangarh Shield. So Kishangarh is a shield, a tournament that is played in a triangular series. The Mayo, Scindia, and Daly College. And there are more than one game. So there is soccer, there is cricket, there is hockey. We lifted the Kishangarh Shield for the 12th time in a row, beating the other two, Mayo and Scindia! One of the board members of Mayo, who is known to someone I know, mentioned to him last week when they sent a letter to us to come, you know, and receive the trophy. He says, "Mayo College made this Kishangarh Trophy. It went from here I 2 years ago and Daly College is not returning it to us!"

IPSC tournaments, which we all know are at the All India level, so I am just saying IPSC, we all know they are all at the All India level. Our wait list for victory is long. So I am only sharing the top two and I will go very quickly with this. Under-14 Boys' Tennis, Under-19 and Under-14 Boys' Shooting, and Under-12 Boys' Table Tennis-all of these we won at the national level. And the first Runner-up in Under-17 and Under-14 Girls' Hockey, Under-19 and Under-17 Girls' Shooting, Under-19 Boys' Cricket, Under-19 Boys' Skating, Under-19, Under-14, Under-12 Boys' Squash, Under-14 Girls' Squash, Under-19, Under-17, Under-14 Girls' Swimming, Under-14 Girls' Tennis-all of these, the first Runners-up positions. Yes, it's not easy.

IPSC has the likes of the finest schools in the country. When we breathe IPSC, we breathe Doon, Mayo, Wellham, Scindia, Modern School, DPS

RK Puram, Rajkumar College. We breathe these schools in IPSC. And to beat them all and bring home so many trophies, ladies and gentlemen, my boys and girls deserve a loud round of applause. Let me also show off to you once again with a comparison of a medals tally.

Last year in my report, I compared the medals tally with the previous year. So, just for one, just to give you a sense of the growth trajectory, I'm just mentioning that in Athletics, we lifted 34 gold. Last year it was 17, so we've doubled it. And the year before last, it was 15. In Athletics, 26 silver has gone up from 23 and before that 19. 38 bronze, last year it was 12 and before that it was 9. This is just to give you a sense of the trajectory. Now I'm not going to go to the year before last, let me just compare with last year. Shooting, this year 80 gold, last year 45. This year 73 silver, last year 29. This year 68 bronze, last year 13. Tennis- 32 gold, 27 silver, 11 bronze. Skating- 5 gold, last year there were none and 8 silver. The total medals tally, ladies

and gentlemen, 228 gold, 336 silver and 275 bronze. The number of gold medals, ladies and gentlemen, has doubled! We are talking of gold and we are talking about national, all India level. Gold has doubled and the total medals tally has increased to almost 3 times.

As many as 10 school records were broken in the Inter- House Athletics in October, including the boys' under 17, 400 m record, which was broken by Arush Kandelwal after 44 years. Boys' under 19 discus throw, broken by Kabir Maini after 35 years. So when I had this 40th year batch, who came and said, "Ma'am our batch has a record", I said "It's broken this time". 40 years! And in pole vault U-17, Karan Bachkaniwala after 18 years.

Our success story continues at the School Games Federation of India tournaments, where our athletes compete against the best young talents. The School Games Federation of India has teams from different states. It's not just schools like the IPSC, the Doon ,Mayo and the likes. It has state teams. So we play against Madhya Pradesh, Punjab, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, whatever. It's very, very competitive. At the SGFI, as many as 150 boys and girls qualified for the national tournaments across all games, 51 in athletics alone.

I must, I need a louder applause for our children. It's not a small achievement. And if you don't find sufficient reason to clap, let me tell you, Dr. Manish will tell me that the nerves at the end of these fingers are directly connected to the eyesight. So every time you clap, you are improving your own eyesight. So while we are still at sports, Maharaj Vikram did announce, we have signed off, in the sense that, I mean, I'm very grateful to my board, who spared a lot of time with, you know, vendors, and we have finalized the vendors for upgrading sports facilities. Give me six months, and you'll see a changed face in sports facilities.

The hockey ground will become turf ground amongst the top 2% schools in the country. All basketball courts will have synthetic grounds. Both the swimming pools will be all-weather swimming pools. The athletic ground, where we are having our evening production today, because I said we are going to get into our synthetic grounds next year, so the athletic ground will also be turned into the synthetic, athletic ground, the entire track, with the D inside for field events also. That's huge. Of course, Maharaj's vision is also to do up the cricket ground and make it indoor and upgrade the shooting range also. We are doing so well.

So that's also in the pipeline and a number of other projects. In the interest of time, I'm not enlisting them. But thank you, my dear Board members,

for supporting and taking this vision forward. And it may sound out of place, it's an APG speech, but on this platform, Mr. Dheeraj Lulla, thank you for your fantastic negotiation skills at the finalization of vendors at the board meeting. And thank you, dear Board members, including Mr. Sanjay Pahwa, for very intense engagement with the vendors to understand and then take a decision.

In literary activities, so in the interest of time, what I'm going to do now is just name the activity and the award.

IPSC Visual Art, RKC Raipur: Sublime Harmony Award for Tie and Die, Best Emerging Artist Award for Jewelry Designing, Sublime Harmony Award for Photography; All India Srinjayan Art and Design Fest at Assam

Valley- overall First Runner-up trophy, won the first position in Macrame, first in Still Life Painting, first in Nature Photography, and first in Poster Making, second in Product Design and Textile Design, and third in String Art; Lafayette Zaverian at Gurgaon- first prize in Dance with a cash prize of 25,000; IPSC Dance, we



clinched prizes for Outstanding Performance in Choreography and Western Group Dance also for Outstanding Award. There are no ranks that are given in the IPSC dance. Our dancers also gave a commendable performance at the Dance Festival in Turkey.

IPSC Music Fest at Scindia School- Awards for Excellence in Hindi Group Song, in Sufi-Qawwali Group Song, in Indian Instrumental Orchestra and Western Vocal Solo. Again, there are no ranks, so meritorious and performance for excellence are the highest awards.

IPSC Lit Fest in Nainital-Award for Best Use of Sound in Triologue competition; Silver Jubilee Commemorative Young Thinkers Conclave at the Mayo Girls' Ajmer- Best Ensemble Award in Twistology and the Best Critic Award for English Creative Writing. At Aspirations and Online Discursive Thinking Exploration at Varanasi- the Best Writer Award for Exceptional Creative Writing. At the All India Platinum Jubilee Memorial Inter-School Debate at the Scindia School Gwalior- Best Speaker Award in Preliminary.

At the Junior English Debating Invitational Cup at The Doon School, we secured five Best Speaker Awards. We participated in 12 MUNs this year,

four Best Delegates, 10 High Commendations, 16 Special Mentions, 11 Verbal Mentions and five Best Position Papers. Winners- PG Miller Memorial Invitational Quiz, IPSC Literary Fest Quiz Segment and also the Most Promising Quizzer Award. And the crowning glory, ladies and gentlemen, at the Inter-City Quizzing Challenge organized by NIT Bhopal, we emerged as Indore winners, so we were named Team Indore and then it was a state-level competition from all the cities of Madhya Pradesh. Guess what? We became the Madhya Pradesh champions! Hindi Literary Activity, IPSC Lit Fest, again at Nainital- Best Research Team and Overall Outstanding Speaker.



Internationalism-13 students went for exchange trips to Denmark and Hungary. Nine attended the Round Square exchange programs in various overseas Round Square schools, which include the Hotskills School, USA, Scotch College, Australia, Bunbury Cathedral, Grammar, Australia, the Landhim MRC, Germany, St. Stithians Girls' College, South Africa. A total of five students from

Germany, Scotch College, Australia and St. Stithians, South Africa were hosted by us. Two of our students attended the prestigious Round Square International Service Project in Thailand. Five attended the Round Square International Conference in Bogota, Colombia with a post-conference in Brazil.

Twenty-six attended the Round Square Conference in RS member schools in India. Seven students attended the RS Conference in Woodridge College and Preparatory School, South Africa. Six in the Sambath Church Academy, UK and another six at the Paradise International College, Romania. Sixty-three participated in the RS Zoom Postcards hosted by various Round Square schools in India, including us, South Africa, Japan, UAE and China.

Ladies and gentlemen, I know it's getting tiring for you to hear. Can you imagine what the children must have put in to achieve all of this? DC students participated in Round Square's first ever worldwide Show and Tell sessions for the age group eight to ten on the theme of Traditional Games in our Country. We collaborated on a project on Sustainable Art around the world hosted by Michael Hamm, Argentina. Our school undertook an inspiring project and this idea came from one of the children. He said, "Ma'am, we must donate our old shoes. We outgrow them so soon and they're expensive shoes. They don't wear out. We must donate them to the

underprivileged." I said, "Give it a name, we'll do it." And he named it, the name of the project was Sole Support, S-O-L-E. The idea came from the child, the name came from the child, and you should have seen how these children donated for the underprivileged.

Looking at the grand success of our regular annual Panna Project. We have been chosen to host the Round Square International Service Project at the buffer village of Panna Tiger by Round Square International. The last time India got a Round Square International project was 15 years back at Dehradun. We've got it now this year scheduled for December 25. Expression, Connection, and Contribution!

Ladies and gentlemen, Contribution. The best contribution one can make to humanity is to improve oneself, said by Frank Herbert. A host of teacher training sessions were organized, including CBSE's capacity building program on the theme Happy Classroom, two days' Adolescence Life Skills and Mental Health Summit, a two day incentive training of teachers' workshop for principals and teachers across Madhya Pradesh, Montessori training for our primary teachers, training by Tinker Village on teaching STEM subjects.

Daly College also hosted two teacher trainees, Martin and Amy, from the Melbourne Graduate School of Education, University of Melbourne. We hosted a number of events, G-Literati, a Pan India Literary Festival, the Indore Literature Festival, Roundtable of Principals as part of the Great Indian School Tour, our Immerse and Inspire program continues with thundering success, our new initiative, the first school to bring Oxford Union Debate style to India, Constitutional Debates at Daly College, CD at DC, was incredibly heartening. Mr. Prashant Bhushan and Mr. Gopal Shankar Narayan, along with others, debated with our ace, Saara Lunawat.

We were privileged to host innumerable distinguished personalities. To name a few, Captain Ashim Mitra, Mr. Manoj Bajpayee, Dr. Ameeta Mulla Wattal, Dr. Sushant Kalra, Dr. Sundeep Kochar, His Excellency, Javier

Paulinich, Ambassador to Peru, Ma'am Shabnam Minwalla, the author, Mr. Rajmohan Singh, Mr. Edward Rippeth, Leena Asher, Amarjit Singh Mehta.

The crowning glory, of course, was Ma'am Sudha Murty and yesterday, Mr. Rajdeep Sardesai. All



our activities, all our achievements, everything that we have accomplished are a testament to what I'm speaking about. Expression, Connection, and Contribution.

It is therefore not surprising as Maharaj Vikram announced that we won the first position by Education World in the Vintage Legacy Day Cum Boarding Schools category for the third year. Ladies and gentlemen, for our old Dalians, I don't know which expression, which word to use. Expression, Connection, or Contribution!

I think it's all three. It's all three for my current students and it's all three for my old Dalians. Expression, it is so heartening to see them expressing their love and respect for their alma mater. It is so heartening to see the connect. I was there at the ACB in Chandigarh. I was overwhelmed and moist-eyed to see the phenomenal respect the old Dalians had when I arrived there, led by none other than Mr. Pankaj Bagadia himself. It speaks volumes of the value system that Daly College gives to anyone who passes through this blessed land. And Contribution, of course, I don't know of any school that has such a strong alumni bond.

That is a tremendous achievement and vision that allows for this.

As we celebrate the achievements of the students today, let us also remember the values instilled by this institution—discipline, courage, and the unwavering pursuit of excellence. To the young scholars here, the awards you receive today are a testament to your hard work and your potential. Carry forward the good name, repute, and legacy of Daly College with humility, purpose, and commitment to contribute

meaningfully to society. Always be proud of being a Dalian, no matter what challenges life throws at you.

This being the 300th birth anniversary of Punyashlok Lokmata Devi Ahilyabai Holkar, my hope is that each of you will have a chance to learn from her life history. 
ODA Family Picnic

Scotch College, Perth, Australia


Two students from Scotch College, Perth, Australia visited Daly College on RS Student Exchange Programme. They attended class XCI.






WORLDWIDE SHOW & TELL SESSION


DC Students participated in Round Square's first ever Worldwide Show and Tell sessions for the age group 8-10 yrs, the theme was - Traditional Games in our Country.


Collaboration with Michael Ham School, Argentina








Story Relay- Pass the Baton collaboration with SAI International School

The Baraza leaders of classes 11 and 12 facilitated discussions, beginning with an engaging ice breaker, the "Robotic Dance," and meaningful discussions.












Round Square Heroes Discovery Framework

A Year of Sporting Excellence – 2024

Sports instill discipline, resilience, and teamwork, shaping students beyond the classroom. At Daly College, 2024 has been a landmark year in sports, with our athletes breaking records, securing victories, and demonstrating exceptional dedication.

Track and Field Triumphs - Daly College excelled in track and field at CBSE and IPSC meets. The Boys' Team won Overall Champions at the CBSE Cluster 12 Athletic Meet, securing 7 Golds, while the Girls' Team finished as Runners-up with 3 Gold, 5 Silver, and 5 Bronze medals. Fourteen athletes qualified for the CBSE Nationals. At the 59th All India IPSC Meet, the Girls' Team secured Overall Runners-up for the second consecutive year, and the Boys' Team finished 2nd Runners-up.

Hosting IPSC Events & National Representation - Daly College successfully hosted IPSC tournaments in Shooting, Squash, Hockey, Cricket, Tennis, and Athletics Trials. Our teams participated in IPSC and SGFI meets, securing top honors and strengthening our national presence.

Tennis Sensations - Our players excelled nationally and internationally: Pehal Kharadkar won the IPSC U-19 title in Colombo and reached the J30 semi-finals in Nairobi. Shravya Sojatia won the All India Championship Series Tennis Doubles (U-14).

The Boys' Team won U-17 and U-14 categories. Daly College emerged as Overall Champions of the 19th All India IPSC Boys Shooting Championship.

Aquatic Success - At the 37th All India IPSC Aquatic Girls Championship, Daly College finished Runners-up with 40 medals. Abeer Singh Mehta was the fastest swimmer, winning Gold in the 50m freestyle. The Boys' team secured 7 medals, with 11 swimmers qualifying for SGFI Nationals.







Greetings

Cambridge Report - The Cambridge International program, established in 2010, provides a unique lens for understanding and tackling real-world challenges through education. Its cornerstone is the development of practical skills, fostering students' critical thinking abilities and social competencies through a holistic educational framework. The program encourages collaborative learning, with students supporting one another while maintaining exceptional academic standards across all aspects of the Cambridge International curriculum.

This commitment to excellence was particularly evident in the recent IGCSE examination period, which yielded remarkable results.

Grade X - 28 students appeared for IGCSE in the March series in 2024. 45 % students secured grades A * and A, including 21% students securing A *. 40 % of students were awarded a distinction, 60% students were awarded a Merit/Pass in the Cambridge ICE Group Award. 10 students have scored 6 or more A*/As.

Aditya Dev topped the class with 8A* and 1A, Niaa Baheti scored 7A*, 2A and Vansh Poddar secured 7 A* 1A 1B. All students cleared the class 10 IGCSE Board Examinations.

Career Counseling Report -

Daly College takes a comprehensive approach to preparing students for their future careers. Through personalized guidance and diverse resources, students develop essential skills and knowledge that serve them throughout their lives. The institution encourages students to make productive use of their summer breaks by participating in various enrichment activities. These include attending summer camps and schools, conducting research, writing academic papers, and gaining hands-on experience through internships. This proactive approach to learning ensures students develop strong profiles and adapt effectively to changing professional landscapes. 15 students completed an AI Internship with Amazon Web Services, through Corporate Gurukul – AIAWS in July 2024.

The students of Classes 7-9 are enrolled in Project Based Learning by KRUU, where they interact with professors from around the world, do projects in different fields, and explore what's best for them.

A group of 55 students with three teachers visited NUS Singapore, to gain insights and understand career opportunities in STEAM education at a world class university, gain insights on university admissions opportunities and experience campus life at National University of Singapore (NUS) (Ranked 8th in the world by QS). Students also completed the research program GRIP. GRIP is a dynamic approach to Project-based learning through which students gain knowledge and skills to investigate, research and respond to an engaging and complex question, or challenge using a designthinking approach. The Class of 2024 students have achieved notable admissions both within India and abroad. Within India, several students have secured coveted spots in prestigious institutions such as IIM Indore, Ashoka University, OP Jindal Global University. Additionally, in Delhi University, admissions have been obtained in esteemed colleges like Hansraj College and SRCC. Furthermore, students have enrolled in renowned institutions like Christ University in Bangalore. In Mumbai, a significant number of students are pursuing their education at NMIMS, Jai Hind College, St. Xavier's College, Mithibai College. Once again this year, our students have successfully gained admission to numerous prestigious universities around the globe, including but not limited to: Imperial College London(2 students) Embry Riddle Aeronautical University USA, Indiana University Bloomington, USA, Boston University, UT Dallas, University of Wisconsin, Madison USA, University of Washington, Stony Brook, USA, Drexel University in the USA, University of Toronto in Canada, UNSW in Australia, University of Western Australia, and Lasalle College of Arts, Singapore, Penn State USA, and some more.

On the same day 90 plus National and International Universities showcased their offerings in the University Fair, students closely interacted with them and gained information on various aspects of University admissions.




CD@DC: A Defining Debate in Legal Discourse
