Vasudhara Panghal of VDJIS, Hisar, and Oshin Sharma from EHIS were adjudged the best speakers from their rounds while Samiksha Singh of VDJS and Titash Roy of LKS received consolation prizes. In the preliminary round of JK Kate Memorial Hindi Debate, students expressed their opinions and facts on the topic, 'India is an Intolerant nation', where three students each from six schools were for the motion while students from rest of the schools were against the motion. Participants spoke about incidents where people were

disrespected and defamed when they expressed their opinion in public and the students against the motion said the constitution has given everyone equal rights hence defending their side. In the PG Miller Quiz, two students from each school participated and the quiz master for the same was Dyu D'Cunha. Emerald Heights emerged victorious and quizzed their way to the top after an intriguing super over tie breaker, followed by the Doon School and YPS Mohali. INTER HOUSE INDIAN MUSIC



With 225 delegates from 17 different schools and 3 different countries, the Daly College embarked on a journey for the first of its kind Youth Parliament in the country held from the 24th to 26th of June 2016.

Seven committees were simulated. The Constituent Assembly of 1946 witnessed serious debate on the formation of states and finally they managed to change what the Map of India looks like with no Pakistan but Hyderabad as an independent Nation; the 1991 Lok Sabha saw new Bills being passed making economic reforms to change the face of the Indian Economy and introduction of Liberalization, Privatization and Globalization of policies. The two overseas legislative councils included were The United States Senate Committee on Foreign Affairs and the British House of Commons. BREXIT was the hot topic of discussion in the



House Commons whereas heated debates on US's foreign relations with Iraq, Iran and Syria were seen in the US Senate committee.

The Ad Hoc Committee on women saw very serious discussions on gender discrimination against women and despite disagreements they were able to pass a report. The Futuristic National Security Council placed in the year 2100 went through a series of crisis and in the midst of it all the future high ranking officers, of one of the Super Powers of the world; India, discussed the redrafting of its National Security Policy. The Indian Press Committee simulated three Indian Dailies. Here there were no delegates but reporters who like the journalists brought back reports of the different committees.

The very successful three- day conference concluded with a closing ceremony, which was looked forward by all the delegates, since it included the most quintessential part of the conference, namely, the prize distribution! With the completion of this conference, we ended up marking a new beginning, since it has left an appreciable impact on everyone and especially the young delegates who have returned enriched and ready to bring about a change, as the theme of the conference suggests realizing the power within them (the youth). 


