


As such, teachers and parents are in a great position to ensure reading is a key part of children's daily routine.



where the teacher fell asleep. All their heads began to rattle as they bellowed long and deep.


When they read about the lunchroom and the stuff in Lost and Found they began shake and wobble, and they crumpled to the ground.
