
ALTERNA IN SUSSER





## Light and Shadow

#### **Background** information

Light can pass through some types of objects. Objects that allows light to pass through it so a clear image can be seen is called transparent. Glass is transparent and this property is used for windows. Objects that allows some but not all of the light to pass through, it is called translucent. Wax paper is translucent. Objects that does not allow any light to pass through it is called opaque. A shadow forms when an opaque or translucent object blocks the light.




